

ORDINANCE 2017-1723

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY OF MURRAY CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 90, ANIMALS, SPECIFICALLY §90.99, PENALTY, IN ORDER TO BRING SAME INTO COMPLIANCE WITH KENTUCKY GENERAL ASSEMBLY HOUSE BILL 422, SIGNED INTO LAW ON APRIL 9, 2016.

WHEREAS, the City of Murray desires to amend Chapter 90, specifically, §90.99, Penalty, to bring the Chapter into compliance with the Kentucky General Assembly House Bill 422, signed into law on April 9, 2016.

WHEREAS, the Murray City Council has reviewed and discussed the following proposed changes to Chapter 90, specifically §90.99 of the City Of Murray Code Of Ordinances and believe the changes are reasonable and necessary.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Murray, as follows:

AMENDMENT I. ADDITIONS, ASSERTIONS & CHANGES:

§ 90.99 PENALTY is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

(A) Each violation of this Chapter shall constitute a civil offense. The penalty for the first violation and each subsequent violation of any provision of this chapter shall be range from \$50 to \$500 and

~~(B) The penalties set forth above shall be imposed and enforced by the Murray Code Enforcement Board pursuant to §40.39 of the Code of Ordinance for the City of Murray.~~

Nothing in this Ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in this Ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

All other sections and provisions of the Ordinances for the City of Murray, not specifically amended herein, shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be considered amended and shall be incorporated by reference as if fully stated herein.
