Murray Code Enforcement Board Minutes August 6, 2013

The Murray Code Enforcement Board met in regular session on August 6, 2013 at 5:00 p.m. in the council chambers of City Hall located at 104 North 5th Street.

Board Members Present: Sam Underwood, Danny Brittain and Thomas Rottinghaus

Others Present: Dannetta Clayton, David Roberts, Fire Marshal Dickie Walls, Officer Jay Herndon and general audience.

Chairman Thomas Rottinghaus called the meeting to order and an attendance roll call was then taken.

Approval of February 5, 2013 Minutes: Motion made by Sam Underwood to accept and seconded by Danny Brittain.

<u>Default Case – Franshawn Strickland:</u> Chairman Rottinghaus called the public hearing to order and Dannetta Clayton read the case information. Chairman asked the board if they had any direct or indirect financial or personal interest in any matter to be decided by the Board. All Board members answered no. Chairman Rottinghaus asked if the officer that issued the citation was present and he was not. Chairman Rottinghaus asked the Board their thoughts on the citation. Chairman asked the board if they had any direct or indirect financial or personal interest in any matter to be decided by the Board. All Board members answered no. Chairman Rottinghaus stated that based on the evidence provided in the written citation there were two dogs loose and in the middle of the street. **Danny Brittain made a motion that Franshawn Strickland shall pay a fine in the amount of \$100 to the City Customer Service Center within 30 days. Sam Underwood seconded the motion and it carried by a 3-0 roll call vote.**

<u>Default Case – Darren Moore:</u> Chairman Rottinghaus called the public hearing to order and Dannetta Clayton read the case information. Chairman asked the board if they had any direct or indirect financial or personal interest in any matter to be decided by the Board. All Board members answered no. Fire Marshal Dickie Walls came forward and was sworn in. Marshal Walls stated the fire department was dispatched to 707 Sycamore and upon arrival noticed a barrel with black smoke coming out of it. Marshal Walls went on to say that when the Respondent noticed the fire department he tried to cover the barrel. Marshal Walls stated that the fire department observed oil and wiring in the barrel. Marshal Walls stated they asked the Respondent to extinguish the fire and he did, the Respondent was issued a citation. Chairman Rottinghaus asked the Board if they had any questions. **Sam Underwood made a motion that**

Darren Moore shall pay a fine in the amount of \$50 to the City Customer Service Center within 30 days. Danny Brittain seconded the motion and it carried by a 3-0 roll call vote.

<u>Default Case – Kendrick Tharpe:</u> Chairman Rottinghaus called the public hearing to order and Dannetta Clayton read the case information. Chairman asked the board if they had any direct or indirect financial or personal interest in any matter to be decided by the Board. All Board members answered no. Officer Jay Herndon came forward and was sworn in. Officer Herndon came forward and stated that the Respondent, Kendrick Tharpe was advised two previous times to turn the music down. Officer Herndon stated than upon arriving the third time he could hear the music from the railroad tracks, and asked the Respondent to shut the music and party down. Officer Herndon stated that the Respondent was then issued a citation. **Danny Brittain made a motion that Kendrick Tharpe shall pay a fine in the amount of \$100 to the City Customer Service Center within 30 days. Sam Underwood seconded the motion and it carried by a 3-0 roll call vote.**
