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MINUTES OF COUNCIL

June 8, 2017

6:30 P.M.

The Murray City Council met in regular session Thursday, June 8, 2017, at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall with Mayor Jack Rose presiding.

Council Members Present: Jeremy Bell, Johnny Bohannon, Wesley Bolin, Linda Cherry, Danny Hudspeth, Jason Pittman, John Mark Roberts, Jane Shoemaker, Burton Young

Council Members Absent: Robert Billington, Dan Miller, Pat Scott

Staff Present: City Attorney Warren Hopkins, Chief Liles, Cathy Morris, Jim Osborne and Matt Turner

After a moment of silence, John Mark Roberts led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Rose welcomed Council members and guests and called the meeting to order.

The Minutes of the Council Meeting of May 25, 2017 were presented for approval. **Mr. Roberts moved; seconded by Ms. Shoemaker.** All present voted aye.

Mayor Rose presented the Mayor's Report as outlined below:

- a) Mayor Rose reported the City of Murray recently received notification of a TAP Grant award in the amount of \$799,985.00 from the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet. Mayor Rose further explained that this award required a 20 percent match from the City of Murray in the amount of \$199,996.00. Mayor Rose advised the Council that this grant will be utilized to construct sidewalks on 641 North from KY 121 to Stadium View Drive. The sidewalks will continue the full length of Stadium View Drive and end at the intersection with Diuguid Drive. Mayor Rose went on to state that the City of Murray had recently applied for a Delta Regional Authority grant as well. He advised the Council that he hoped it would help with a possible future project that would be very beneficial to the community.
- b) Mayor Rose made the Council aware of a recent article in the Paducah Sun which outlined City and County population growth in the Purchase area. Mayor Rose pointed out that Paducah had grown by only 121 residents from 2010 to 2016. Mayor Rose went on to point out that the City of Murray had grown by 1265 residents. The population of Mayfield stayed relatively flat during that same time period.

Public Comment Mayor Rose stated there was no request for Public Comment.

Municipal Order 2017-015 reappointing Ruth Daughaday to the Housing Authority Board for a four (4) year term to expire June 20, 2021. **Mr. Bohannon moved; seconded by Ms. Cherry.** All present voted aye.

Municipal Order 2017-016 reappointing Danny Brittain to the Code Enforcement Board for a three (3) year term to expire June 12, 2020. (Clerk Osborne advised the Council that the date on the agenda read June 12, 2017 and was a clerical error that should read June 12, 2020). **Mr. Bell moved as amended; seconded by Dr. Young.** All present voted aye.

Surplus Matt Turner submitted a list of property from Central Garage and Information Technology to be declared surplus. **Mr. Hudspeth moved; seconded by Ms. Shoemaker.** All present voted aye.

With no other business before the Council, **Mr. Bell moved** to adjourn; **seconded by Mr. Bohannon**. All voted aye. The meeting adjourned at 6:40 p.m.

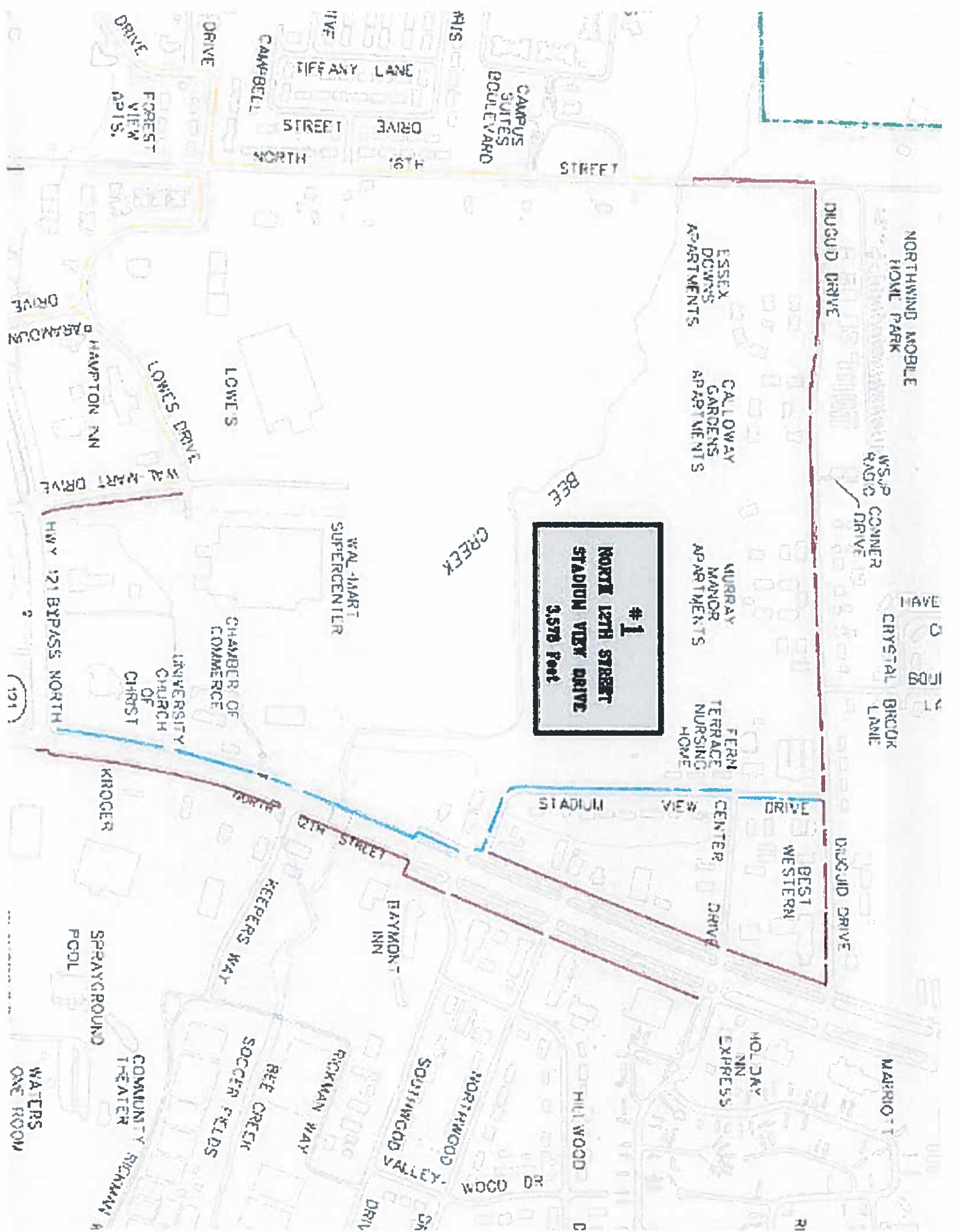
