ADDITIONAL COMMENTS/CONCERNS ON 16th STREET

Make turn lanes with signals at Five-Points on all intersecting streets (13)

Close 16th Street from Calloway Street to University Dr. permanently (8)

Close 16th Street temporarily as an experiment but make sure there is well-publicized notice beforehand. (7)

Close 16th Street during certain times of the day such as 8AM – 4:30PM (3) Bike rider fears getting hit on 16th Street.

Major goal is to unify campus not divide it with 16th Street running through it. This could be accomplished by either closing 16th Street or closing 16th Street during the times of day with the most pedestrian traffic.

Preferably close 16th Street but if not close then try a stop light to control both vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

If close 16th Street then build up smaller streets like 18th Street.

Do not want a bridge over 16th Street. Bridges are creepy. Try instead a raised crosswalk at each designated crosswalk.

The campus is growing and the 3 presented proposals make it difficult to grow.

Do not like the 3 proposed 16th Street options because they're too expensive and they disturb the flow of students. They are extreme and not needed.

If 16th Street is closed how will the parking off 16th be affected?

The crosswalks on 16th Street are the safest crosswalks on campus. Crosswalk under the bridge needs repairing.

I believe the City of Murray is on the incline for major growth. If 16th Street is closed, once citizens get used to the new variable of travel time and routes it will become 2nd nature. We are a small town that doesn't like change. I think most days we will enjoy the city growth.

Don't do any of the 3 options.

MSU students and commuters on the road in general just need to be more conscious/attentive/observant while driving or crossing 16th St. Promoting Awareness is the best solution. Save money and encourage students and citizens to look out for each other "literally" when it comes to crossing or heeding pedestrians on 16th. Eye contact needs to be made before crossing.

The bride over 16th Street is probably the best and cheapest option that could be done the quickest.

A bridge over 16th Street for foot traffic is the best solution and building it over the summer break would have the least negative impact.

Don't make a rash decision; study/weigh pros/cons of every possible option before making a permanent decision. A bridge would be way too much and would be an eyesore distracting from the view of the science buildings!
