

MINUTES OF COUNCIL

March 8, 2018

6:30 P.M.

The Murray City Council met in regular session Thursday, March 8, 2018, at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall with Mayor Jack Rose presiding.

Mayor Rose called the meeting to order and welcomed Council members and guests.

After a moment of silence, Wesley Bolin led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Minutes of the Council Meeting of February 22, 2018, were presented for approval. **Mr. Bohannon moved; seconded by Mr. Bell. All present voted Aye.**

Mayor's Report

- a) Mayor Rose recognized Carol Brunn, Special Projects Coordinator of Murray Town and Gown. Ms. Brunn stated the Millennials in the Workplace workshop was held on March 7, 2018, and Mayor Carter Hendricks of Hopkinsville was the speaker. She stated 63 people representing 22 industries and organizations were in attendance. Ms. Brunn thanked the Council and the City for their sponsorship of the event. Mayor Rose recognized John Mark Roberts, who attended the conference. Mr. Roberts gave an overall report and shared statistics that were presented at the workshop.
- b) Mayor Rose recognized Jim Osborne. Mr. Osborne presented the tentative schedule for upcoming budget meetings.
- c) Mayor Rose recognized Jim Osborne. Mr. Osborne stated HB 366 in 2018-2019 would provide 2 million dollars to be split between the 39 TVA counties and in 2019-2020, 4 million dollars. He stated this money is to be used for economic development. Mayor Rose stated if the bill is approved, the first year each county would receive approximately \$50,000 and the next year approximately \$100,000.

Resolution 2018-002 A resolution of the City of Murray, Kentucky urging the Kentucky General Assembly to pass Legislation during the 2018 regular session which redirects a portion of the in-lieu-of tax payments the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) pays to the State back to the TVA counties for economic development and job creation purposes. **Mr. Roberts moved; Ms. Shoemaker seconded. All present voted Aye.**

Public Comment Mayor Rose reported that there were no requests for public comment.

With no other business before the Council, **Mr. Billington moved to adjourn; seconded by Mr. Bohannon. All present voted Aye.**

The meeting adjourned at 6:51 p.m.
